#### North Georgia Annual Conference June 2021

#### **CLERGY EXECUTIVE SESSION**

William E. Dickens (Rev Ed) elected as member in full connection.

William E. Dickens (Rev Ed) approved for ordination and was ordained on June 5, 2021.

An Annual Conference gathering of Clergy is scheduled for Aug 12, 10-12.

Rev Ed re-appointed to Kresge as Pastor-in-Charge as a Full Connection Elder

#### **BUSINESS SESSION**

1331 Lay Delegates 1331 Clergy Delegates 2662 Total Delegates

Lowest vote total was 1155, highest vote total was 1357 (many delegates did not participate)

By a vote of 957 yes, 201 no, 44 abstaining \$2,972,044 Wesley Campership Fund, which provided scholarships for underprivileged children and youth to attend camp was reallocated and given to North Georgia Camp and Retreat Ministry capital endowment to fund infrastructure.

By a vote of 1153 yes, 28 no, 14 abstaining the Commission on Equitable Compensation recommendation not to propose an increase to 2022 minimum compensation was approved.

Estimated Costs associated with a Full Connection Elder: (pg 82 AC Handbook)

Minimum Total Compensation \$40,000 (Sec I & II of the Clergy Financial Support Worksheet)

Minimum Housing allowance \$17,600 (not applicable to Kresge – parsonage)

Pension \$9,820
Health Insurance \$15,000
Continuing Education \$800
Total Estimated Cost \$83,220

Minimum Standard for Church-provided parsonages can be found on page 83-88

"it is expected that measures will be taken by the local church to bring their parsonages within these standards as soon as possible." (lines 43-44, pg 83) ... "All parsonages shall be updated or renovated to conform as nearly as possible to the suggested minimum standards in the guidelines which were approved by the annual conference in 2016. Any parsonages not meeting the standards must be approved for usage by the district superintendent on an annual basis." (lines 3-7, pg 85)

Two items listed on page 84 jump out:

#4. Climate control: Central heat and air are required, along with insulation to meet present day building codes. Energy efficient windows and doors are to be provided in order to conserve energy.

#11. Wiring/Plumbing: All wiring and plumbing must conform to present day codes and are to provide for present and future needs in order that all appliances and computer equipment may be used safely. All receptacles must be properly grounded.

Our One Board/Trustees have taken measures to have a new roof put on the parsonage and are in the process of purchasing/installing new energy effect windows and approving re-insulating the attic. Completion of these actions will bring #4 into compliance.

Most of the plugs have been rewired with grounded plugs. Though several remain that are ungrounded. It may be a good idea to bring an electrician in to give an opinion.

"It is recommended that the church's annual budget include a parsonage fund equivalent to at least 3% of the value of the property for the purpose of repairs, maintenance, pest control and insurance. Unused yearly funds should be placed in an interest-bearing account to be used for capital expenses of the parsonage to include the future purchase of a new parsonage when the current one does not meet minimum parsonage standards." (lines 25-30, pg 85) We need to take this under consideration as we build the 2022 budget.

"Every parsonage shall have a parsonage file" (line 34, pg 85) To my knowledge there is not a file like this.

#### FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Fund Balance Report shows the Annual Conference has \$77,099,350 fund balance as of 12.31.2020 an increase off \$26,112.106 from end of 2019.

The Council of Finance and Administration reports: The 2020 NGC budget decreased 7.8% from the previous year. The 2021 budget led to an additional 19% reduction. The proposed 2022 budget totals \$17,099,834, which results in a 5% decrease. Conference employees did not receive a pay increase in 2021. The 2022 budget includes a 2.3% increase for district superintendents and a 2.2% increase for other conference staff." (lines 12-16, pg 97)

Clergy appointed to the UM Center (Conference Hqs) receive housing allowance of \$32,749 per year and utility allowance of \$5000 per year) (\$37,749 total)

\$1,500,000 is allocated for 8 District Superintendent's Compensation (salaries, health insurance and pension benefits) \$1,500,000 / 8 = \$187,500

#### **RESOLUTIONS**

Resolution 701. Recognizing Our Role in Segregation and the Central Jurisdiction (pg 149) was approved 881 yes, 232 no, 86 abstain.

Resolution 702. Resolution Reducing Suicide Among At-Risk Native Americans (pg150) was approved 1095 yes, 64 no, 46 abstain.

Resolution 703. Resolution in Support of the Protocol of Grace and Reconciliation through Separation (pg 151) was approved 759 yes, 414 no, 84 abstain.

Resolution 704. Resolutions Relating to Rental/Housing Allowances for Retired, Disabled, or Former Clergypersons of the North Georgia Annual Conference (pg 152-153) was not voted on.

"Churches receiving new pastors shall pay the moving expenses of the clergy, not to exceed \$6,000. (lines 31-32, pg 160) We need to address in budget build 2020/review our progress toward this amount)

Several motions to amend the standing rules were approved – these reduced the number of members on different administrative committees.

Rev Ed was re-elected to serve on the Conference Housing and Homeless Council class of 2018.

Rev Ed is appointed to serve on the District Strategic Growth Team.
