From our One Board Leadership ...

After several months of prayer, study, discernment, and discussion your One Board has agreed to hold a congregational vote concerning disaffiliation from The United Methodist Church. This week we mailed a letter to our District Superintendent informing her of the decision and requesting she schedule a church conference for the matter to be voted on by the congregation.

When that date is established, we will schedule at least two congregational town hall meetings for public discussion and question/answer periods. We will invite some outside subject mater experts to speak from different perspectives.

It takes 66.6% of the number who vote to approve disaffiliation. If that percentage is not met then Kresge will remain UMC; if that percentage is met Kresge will initially become an independent congregation. If there is desire, we can join with another denomination, but that would be a separate matter to vote on.

Steps for disaffiliation can be found in the 2553 Disaffiliation Packet, Revised 6-1-2022. Copies are in the church office.

Please take time to read and study reliable and moderate sources. There are extreme voices making noise on all sides of this issue that is before the General Church as a whole and our congregation specifically.

There are copies of many of the articles and sources your One Board has been reading in the office for your use.

Your One Board will keep you informed as dates are known and next steps are scheduled. Pray for us, pray for Reverend Ed, pray for Kresge as whole, pray for The United Methodist Church, pray for future expressions of Methodism, pray God's will be done on earth as it is heaven.

How do we respond to God's awesome, fantastic, free gift? Do we love God first, foremost and always? Do we love others as God loves us? Do we love ourselves as God loves others and us? Do we believe God loves us so much He sent His only Son to take on all our sin? So that we may live eternally, everlastingly with Him, starting now?

Proceeds from this year's March to the Manger offering will be used to bolster and support the missions and ministries included in our approved 2023 General Fund Budget. Please pray about your gift, then be obedient to that which God lays on your heart.

This year we bring a special offering to the manger during our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services. Please designate your gift to "March to the Manger" offering. You may donate during a Sunday service if you will not be able to attend our Christmas Eve service.

The approved 2023 budget is \$226,838, an \$1693 increase compared to 2022. As of 10.31.2022 (10 months into the year) we have spent only \$169,664 or 75.36% of the approved budget. While giving is \$14,270 behind the same time last year our spending is \$55480 less than the total budget. This means we haven't accomplished as much through missions and ministries as we had hoped and planned. May this not be the case in 2023. Let's pray that in 2023 we will be better disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love God, others and self extravagantly and witness boldly.
